Item

1. Welcome and apologies

In attendance were: AS, CA, CM, DJ, FB, JA, JJ, JP, JR, MP, MW, MY, SD, SP and YQ.

Apologies were received from BW.

GIPC was reminded to be cognisant of competition law requirements in discussions and in its work.

GIPC was asked if anyone has a conflict of interest in relation to an agenda item to declare this. None were raised.

2. Minutes of previous meeting

The minutes of the previous meeting held on 15 May were approved.

3. Actions from last meeting

An update on outstanding actions was given, as set out in the table at the end of these minutes.

4. Agenda discussion

- (a) Applications for GIPC roles SP shared the list of applicants for the four advertised vacancies (emerging risks, data science, young actuary and secretary). For each role, GIPC discussed the candidates and shortlisted preferred candidates (where possible), with the next steps being a discussion with the shortlisted candidates ahead of final nomination
- (b) PPC update JJ shared an update from the PPD leads catch up with PPC
 - PPD leads from each PC had a catch up with the PPC and provided PC level updates
 - GI updates included updating PS302 (re long term discount rates), cross practice IN on scheme transfers and advice on policyholder interest, Risk Margins Working Group's plans (re survey) and APRA's consultation on RI framework
 - One point of discussion was on fairness and whether Ian Laughlin's paper should be turned into a

PPD or go into the code of conduct. People feel that this is a fraught area as it is challenging to define and provide guidance on fairness. One option is to opine on fairness and whether insurers have put something in place to consider fairness and use that to inform their decisions. A further question was raised on whether the Institute should have a view on price optimisation. There was also another question on what the scope of a PPD would be in a non-statutory role

- GIPC will be meeting with PPC on 16 October, suggest that GIPC collates any points to raise at that meeting on 9 October
- (c) Updates from topic areas topic leaders from GIPC provided updates on their areas:
 - Injury and disability current / upcoming activities and focus include IDSS, writing joint paper with YDAWG looking at AI in the context of actuaries working in schemes, illiquidity premiums in public sectors, potential submission into NSW parliament's call for submissions on the mental disorder threshold
 - Operational risk submission was made to the APRA governance review
 - Natural perils continuing to build onto the technical paper last year, with the aim of an Insights
 session in Q4. New volunteers have joined with a more specialist pricing background which will
 help with the topics that the WG would like to work on. WG is also thinking about how to use AI to
 supplement what we do in the perils space and looking to write an article on this
 - International IAA held a meeting in Brazil last month. MW will share an update at the next meeting
 - CPD several Insights were run in H1 including colloquy. For H2, Q4 Insights has been pencilled in for natural perils, however still looking for ideas for the Q3 Insights session. Summit has also been run, with IDSS occurring later in the year
 - Education areas on the radar are students' communication skills, particularly in non-standard report writing and the role of education when there is increasing emphasis on AI and data science

(d) Other business

- Newsletter drafting of the next newsletter is currently in progress, with JA seeking further updates from GIPC to go into the newsletter
- Summit GIPC members who attended felt that the conference was good, however noted that the conference cost is high
- APRA's RI review this is progressing, with feedback received and APRA conducting further informal consultations and a response paper is expected to be produced
- Risk register MY has shared a draft of the current risk register and is seeking feedback
- Risk Margins Working Group WG has been working on tackling the confidentiality concerns
 around the survey, and is now consulting with AAs from major insurers to canvas their views on
 the survey
