

Actuarial Educator – Banking

The Actuaries Institute seeks an experienced banking actuary with a passion for educating the next generation!

As the Actuarial Educator responsible for the Banking Principles subject, you will be creating assessments, delivering tutorials and working with a team of volunteers to ensure our students develop their technical skills and theoretical knowledge in areas relevant to the banking sector, and work in an effective and professional manner.

After successful completion of this subject, students will be able to:

- demonstrate knowledge of banking operations, including key components of a bank balance sheet, and the pricing and economics associated with the main banking products;
- describe the key components of the regulatory landscape and corporate governance issues facing banking operations;
- identify and apply techniques to measure the main risks prevalent within a banking operation;
- demonstrate knowledge of the key funding sources for a bank and analyse the pricing and economics associated with different funding sources; and
- describe the key forms of bank capital and demonstrate knowledge of the key principles and methodologies used in bank capital management.

You will:

- work as part of our Education team, and apply our Education policies and tools;
- add your own flair to student engagement including tutorials and discussion boards;
- manage the education volunteers supporting the subject and support the education faculty; and
- call on your experience and professional network to continually improve the subject materials.

You will either work from home or from our Sydney office, as you prefer, commencing in December 2025.

This role is **permanent** and **part time** (40%). As the Banking subject is only taught in Semester 1, this role can either be 6 months a year (January to June); or can be combined with teaching Asset Liability Management in Semester 2 (July to December) to create a 12-months a year role.

In addition to the salary package, the Institute will meet the cost of your professional membership fees and participation at the Summit each year.

Essential requirements:

- Fellowship of the Institute of Actuaries of Australia;
- 10+ years of post-qualification commercial experience in any actuarial practice area;
- demonstrated experience in the banking sector, with evidence of understanding of most of the student outcomes shown above;
- experience in training actuarial graduates on the job or post-graduate teaching;
- excellent interpersonal and communication skills; and
- demonstrated planning and administrative skills.

Desirable (but not essential) requirements:

- qualification in teaching and assessment practices;
- experience in curriculum design and subject material and assessment development; or
- experience in teaching, learning and assessment initiatives within an education context including online delivery and use of Learning Management Systems.
