The **Actuarial Advisor** is responsible for providing high quality analysis and insight to enable the ACC Actuarial team to deliver advice that turns technical information into actionable insights. This role has accountability for delivering significant pieces of work and leading their area of focus, providing coaching and guidance to the team, and managing key relationships with the business.

- Take ownership of streams of work within your area of accountability to ensure objectives are met and new ways of doing things are identified.
- Proactively provide guidance and training to junior staff members to support on the job development and achievement of wider team goals.
- Work with key stakeholders to understand their needs and manage relationships effectively to enable sound challenge and critical thinking.
- Perform high quality actuarial/analytical modelling and analysis to produce insight that enables key stakeholders to make informed decisions for improving customer outcomes, including analysis of the 'why' behind the data and identifying trends.
- Complete analysis that thinks broadly about what it might mean for New Zealanders, communicating what the numbers mean to tell the story behind the data.
- Complete quality assurance (QA) reviews of own and others' work, in accordance with the QA Framework, to ensure we provide accurate information that enables customers to make good business decisions.
- Lead small to medium projects, ensuring outcomes are met through others to help maintain trust and confidence with key stakeholders and deliver a great service to the business.
- Support the implementation of key strategies to support diversity and inclusion.

- Highly developed computer skills (SAS, EXCEL and Word).
- Can demonstrate examples of applying actuarial practices in a business context.
- Relationship and network building.
- Excellent analytical skills.
- Excellent verbal and written communication skills.
- Ability to deliver pieces of work to agreed standards and timeframes.
- Proven performance in the application of the Te Tiriti o Waitangi for the design of policies, systems, and processes.
