Key points

- Good cyber hygiene and security not insurance are the first line of defence.
- A vibrant cyber insurance market will do more than provide financial recompense for risks that break through the first line of defence. It can also strengthen that first line, by offering clear signals and incentives to business – in the form of eligibility, pricing and sharing of insights on best-practice standards.

Gaps in achieving this best-practice ideal

- A severe shortage of qualified cyber security personnel
- Limited understanding of role of cyber insurance among Boards
- Limited education on cyber risks among SMEs
- Achieving sufficient capacity and profitability in the market
- The challenges for insurers in managing accumulation risks
- Cyber hesitancy in seeking the right insurance




